# DISTRICTWIDE FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS WITHOUT A TAX RATE INCREASE

- ✓ IPSD 204 will be able to issue \$420 million of bonds <u>without</u> a tax rate increase. This is possible since the District will pay off outstanding debt.
- ✓ The size of the tax rate that is expiring soon is the same size as the tax rate associated with the new referendum. One cancels out the other, which is how the improvements can be done without a tax rate increase.

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## The proposed improvements would benefit 33 schools and more than 25,000 students.

- Essential improvements can be made <u>without</u> a tax rate increase.
- Districtwide safety and security upgrades would be addressed first.
- ✓ All schools in the District would benefit.
- ✓ IPSD's 33 school buildings are 15-57 years old, and half were built around 35 years ago.
- No new schools would be built. The focus would be on updating existing facilities.
- Three schools are in worse condition than the rest and would get comprehensive updates.

- ✓ Waiting would increase the cost by at least \$16.8 million a year due to construction inflation.
- ✓ It's been 18 years since voters approved funding for school improvements.
- ✓ Savings generated by certain referendum projects could provide funds to help reduce class sizes and address mental health service needs.
- ✓ If approved, the District would provide updates and oversight of all referendum projects on its website and via community and board meetings.





## Proceeds from the 2024 Bond Referendum would address the following capital facility needs:

- ✓ Districtwide security upgrades, including the addition of secure entry vestibules, access controls, intrusion detection systems, and surveillance equipment.
- ✓ **Districtwide infrastructure improvements** tied to air quality, building systems, roofing, health/life safety, site upgrades, and energy efficiency.
- ✓ Renovation of schools to provide quality learning spaces districtwide, including the comprehensive renovation of Waubonsie Valley High School, Hill Middle School, and Gregory Middle School; reconfiguring Neuqua Valley High School to reintegrate freshmen; and expanding elementary school instructional space on the north side of the District.
- ✓ Operational efficiency improvements, including repurposing the Birkett Freshman Center and closing and selling the underutilized Wheatland and Indian Plains buildings.
