Survey of Healthcare Careers Course – Including Mental Health/Behavioral Health Career Exploration

Class Description:

An exploration of various allied health professions, including diagnostic, medical information, rehabilitation, and patient care services with opportunities for mental health/behavioral health career exploration through classroom speakers, job shadowing, and field experiences. This program is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to work in various settings. Students will gain an understanding of the prevalence of mental health issues and the various mental health careers available. Students will receive college credit and a teen mental health certification.

- Completion of Teen Mental Health certification

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Pharmacy Technician Summer Springboard Program

Class Description:

This program is designed to provide students interested in healthcare careers an opportunity to learn about the pharmacy profession. Students will complete 40-hours of classroom experience followed by 20-hours of job shadowing experience. The classroom portion of the summer program consists of lecture, online coursework and hands-on lab work. The outcomes are designed to guide students in learning the foundational knowledge and skills of a pharmacy technician role.

Experience will include:

- Non-credit bearing educational experience, students will complete a capstone project where they will develop, complete, and present on how medication is being used in diseasemanagement culminating in a final presentation.
- Job shadowing opportunities, experiential learning, and field experiences

Schedule:

- June 10, 2025, to August 1, 2025
- Full participation is required, including online coursework and job shadowing.
- In-person sessions every Tuesday, 9:00 AM-12:00 PM, at the College of DuPage main campus in Glen Ellyn.
- The classroom component, including online coursework, must be completed by July 11, 2025.

Requirements:

- 16 years old and above with GPA: 3.0
- · Classwork requires a laptop or desktop computer



- Job shadowing begins on July 14, 2025. Students must comply
 with clinical site onboarding requirements, including vaccination
 and drug screening. Licensing will be completed prior to the job
 shadowing experience. On the first day of class, students will be
 guided through the online application licensing process.
- 30 students will be accepted in the program.

Introduction to Construction Management Course— Including Career Exploration in the Construction Industry: A Variety of Trades, Architecture, and Construction Management

Class Description:

Construction management is a project delivery system emphasizing the roles and responsibilities of construction managers, contractors, subcontractors, owners and design professionals, and how they relate to each other. Fundamentals of project administration from pre-construction planning to project close-out through the study and review of case studies. Includes an overview of cost estimating, meetings, project safety and scheduling. Students will receive three hours of college credit and a variety of job shadowing and field experiences in the trades, architecture, and construction management.

- Student project on innovative environmental ideas for the construction industry



Class Description:
