


One program at NYE that we are proud of developing is our student behavior program, PBIS. "What is PBIS?" PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support and is a framework for setting clear expectations for students, providing support when needed, and recognizing students for positive behavior. Expectation assemblies have begun!!!

During the first week of school, students were introduced to the 3 B's of Nancy Young Elementary. The 3 B's are Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be Safe. During the assembly, staff used a spinner tool that selected random students to choose a prize and we reviewed expectations. Quarterly assemblies to review behavioral expectations will happen at the end of each quarter.

PBIS Team is on the Move

Many things are moving quickly and in a positive direction for the team. The PBIS Team has developed and posted expectation posters around the school, updated our PBIS handbook, and rewarded students for their hard work and great behavior. The PBIS Team and our school have been recognized by Midwest PBIS as a school that has implemented the PBIS practices with fidelity.

Additionally, all staff has been trained on procedural understandings of how to identify major and minor behaviors in class using a flowchart. Students have completed a passport of expectations throughout the school and we have our 3 B's expectations posted through colorful stickers in the stairwells and lobby.

Future Happenings

The team PBIS is now moving toward achieving official PBIS status. Team members will be taking the Tiered Fidelity Inventory team assessment and are working towards a goal of 90% for fidelity of implementation of PBIS practices.

Items that are already in practice are:

- Having an Action Plan
- Resources for parents and families to view on the Nancy Young website
- Monthly data reviews
- Implementation of expectations lessons for teachers to present to students
- Implementation of expectations videos (with help from Spirit Council) for teachers to show to students
- Giving a PBIS staff & team satisfaction survey to NYE staff
- Giving a School Climate survey to 3rd through 5th grade students
- Quarterly newsletters (like this one) to inform our Nancy Young families.
- Staff training opportunities on School Improvement Planning Days and Professional Development Wednesdays to learn/use teaching strategies and restorative practices in their classrooms.

- Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone
- Ensure a good night's sleep
